Trough Talk Demonstration Guidelines

Goal

Let's make agriculture relevant to the non-agriculture public! We want to provide livestock education to the public while showcasing our 4-H and FFA members who want to share their livestock show experiences. Exhibitors will bring their animal and talk about showing livestock.

Guidelines

-  Prepare a presentation using the suggested presentation outline.
-  Demonstration should be 15-20 minutes long. Allow 10 additional minutes for questions.
-  We encourage you to make this a family project. Siblings can present together.
 - You must have a parent, Ag Teacher or Extension Agent present during your presentation.
 - The youth should be the main presenter, but adults are encourage to assist if needed.
-  You must turn in your presentation outline to the Fair by September 1.
-  You must arrive to the Livestock Office 20 minutes before the start of your presentation.
-  The Fair will provide you with a t-shirt. Please wear jeans or slacks for the presentation.
-  An animal must be present during the presentation.
 - Animals must be very gentle and used to people.
 - The Fair will provide a pen or table for small animals such as rabbits and poultry.
-  Bring the items you use to show with; showstick, brush, etc.
-  The Fair will provide a microphone if needed.

Suggested Presentation Outline to Follow

-  Introduction
 - Introduce yourself: Name, age, 4-H club or chapter.
 - Introduce anyone who is helping you.
 - Introduce your animal.
-  Why did you begin showing?
 - Include personal stories.
-  What are the benefits from showing livestock?
 - Have you developed traits such as responsibility, leadership, etc.?
-  What preparations must take place at home before the show?
 - Daily routines; washing, feeding, exercising
 - How you break or train your animal
-  What do you do at the fair to prepare for the show?
 - Demonstrate as much as possible with your animal.
-  Conclusion:
 - Briefly summarize the major points you hit on during your presentation.
 - Tell the audience when and where you will show at during the fair.
 - Ask for questions.
-  Remember to avoid livestock terminology. The general, public does not understand livestock terms. Keep everything very general. If you do use livestock terms, remember to define what you mean.

Presentation Preparation

-  Construct your presentation.
-  Look over your presentation often to know your material.
-  Gather all the items you will need for the day.
-  Request the help of others (parents, 4-H/FFA leaders, etc.).
-  Send the finalized presentation outline to bherndon@tulsastatefair.com by September 1.

Day of Presentation

-  Arrive at the Livestock Office 20 minutes before your presentation.
-  You must wear jeans or slacks. The Fair will provide a t-shirt for you to wear.
-  Come prepared!
 - Your animal must be tame, very gentle and available during the entire presentation.
 - Bring the items you show with and other livestock supplies you need for the demonstration.
 - Necessary material to keep your animal comfortable; feed, water, etc.
 - If you need the Fair to provide you with anything other than a pen you must notify the Fair by September 1.
