

HORSE DIVISION RULES

Please READ all General Rules and Regulations and all Special Rules CAREFULLY.
All exhibitors are responsible for compliance with all rules.

1. **General Rules and Regulations:** The General Rules and Regulations contained and set forth in this Exhibitor Handbook are specifically adopted herein by reference as if specifically set forth. All exhibitors and participants in the Horse Division are required to read and comply with the General Rules and Regulations contained in this Handbook, in addition to the Show Ring Code of Ethics, Animal Health Regulations and the Special Rules in each division participating.

Entry Procedure and Entry Fees

2. **Eligibility:** Competition is open to the world, with the exception of the Junior Shows, which are limited to Oklahoma 4-H and FFA Members, (See Junior General Rules and Regulations). This is an invitational Livestock Show; The Tulsa State Fair reserves the right to extend or withhold an invitation to any Exhibitor or Contestant.

3. **Entry Deadlines:** Entry deadline dates are strictly enforced. Entry deadline dates are as follows:
September 1, 2017: Open Livestock Show, Horse Show, and Junior Livestock Show Entry Deadline
September 13, 2017: Contest and Late Entry Deadline

4. **Submission of Horse Show Entries:** Horse Show entries and payment must be submitted online. Entries submitted online will be accepted until midnight on September 1, 2017. To submit entries online go to the Tulsa State Fair's website, www.tulsastatefair.com.

5. **Submission of Online Late Entry:** Entries saved in the exhibitors cart before September 1 but submitted after September 1 will be charged a \$50.00 processing fee.

6. **Acceptance of Entries:** Show Management reserves the right to reject, accept or conditionally accept any entry and/or late entry. Entry does not guarantee stall, pen or coop space in the barns. Entries received after all stalls, pens or coops have been reserved will be returned to the exhibitor. Omission of fees, invalid or incorrect information will disqualify the entry. *No entries will be accepted via fax or email.

7. **Late Entry Deadline:** Animals not entered by September 1, 2017, can enter until September 9. Late entry cost is the animal and class entry fee plus \$50.00 per animal.

8. **Open Show Animal Substitutions:** Substitutions of Open Livestock and Horse Show animals will be accepted until 12:00 noon the day preceding the specific show for \$10.00. A Substitution Form must be filled out completely. Substitutions must be same breed and/or sex. Change in ownership is not a substitution.

9. **Junior Show Animal Substitutions:** Substitutions of Junior Prospect Steers, Junior Breeding Heifers, Junior Dairy Cattle and Junior Breeding Ewes will be accepted for a \$10.00 fee. A substitution form must be filled out completely. Substitutions must be same species and sex. Change in ownership is not a substitution.

10. **Erroneous Entries:** At the discretion of Show Management, exhibits that have been erroneously entered may be transferred to their proper classes prior to judging. If such classes have been judged they shall not be reopened.

11. **Refunds:** No refunds will be made on incorrect entries or after the closing entry deadline date.

12. **Returned Check:** A \$35 returned check fee will be charged for checks returned by the bank for any reason.

13. **Social Security Number Requirement:** All exhibitors and contestants must have a personal Social Security Number to be eligible to participate in the Tulsa State Fair. International Exhibitors and Contestants may be approved on an individual basis.

14. **Entry Fees:** See individual show rules for horse and class entry fees.

15. Optional Fees:

5-Day Exhibitor Gate Pass	\$25.00
Livestock Exhibitor Parking Pass	\$25.00

16. **5 Day Exhibitor Gate Passes:** Livestock and Horse Exhibitors will receive two, (2), complementary exhibitor passes. Poultry, Rabbit, and Pigeon exhibitors will receive one, (1), pass for every four, (4) animals entered with a maximum of two, (2), complementary passes given to each exhibitor. Exhibitor Gate Passes are good for 5 days. Exhibitor will be responsible for picking up and signing for his/her passes at Gate 7 in the McDonald's Credential Station.

17. **Livestock Exhibitor Parking Passes:** Livestock Exhibitor Parking Passes are good for Lot 6 & 7, September 28 – October 8 upon available space. Passes must be firmly affixed to the left side of the windshield. Partially applied, laminated, wrapped, or taped stickers are not valid. Failure to comply will result in confiscation of Parking Pass and loss of parking privileges.

18. **Reissued Passes:** No passes will be reissued after sold.

19. RV Reservations: R.V. Park reservations will be accepted for a minimum of 11 days only. Deposits on no-shows will be forfeited. Each deposit must accompany the reservation form. This deposit is good from September 28 - October 8, 2017. All Utilities - (Electric, Water & Sewer) \$385.00 for entire fair must deposit \$160.00. *Price Subject to change. Additional days will be charged - \$40.00 per day. If you have not arrived by 4:00 p.m. Thursday, September 28 your space will be released. Persons wishing to rent space in the R.V. parking area, but not planning to be at the Fairgrounds the full 11 days of the Fair, will be handled on a first come, first served basis with regards to available space at the time of arrival. Exhibitor's Duties and Privileges

20. Conduct of Exhibitor: Show Management may prohibit an exhibitor, exhibitor's employee or family member from competing or exhibiting for rude conduct toward any committee, judge, superintendent or any official of the Tulsa State Fair. Such persons may be reinstated after making proper apologies.

21. Disqualified Exhibitor: Any exhibitor who has been disqualified from participation or who has forfeited a premium or award or who has faced other disciplinary action at any livestock show is not eligible to participate in any competition or event at the Tulsa State Fair and the Tulsa State Fair reserves the right to decline entry, disqualify, or expel any such Exhibitor from competition at the Tulsa State Fair.

22. No Adherence to Rules: Any person found guilty of misrepresentation or not abiding by the rules will be disqualified and denied the privilege of showing at Tulsa State Fair.

23. Special Rules: To be eligible to enter, exhibitors and their livestock must meet the special rules of the animal or breed of animal to be exhibited. These requirements are listed in the Special Rules section in the Open Show, Horse Show, and Junior Show divisions.

24. Show Ring Code of Ethics: All exhibitors and contestants competing in the Tulsa State Fair must adhere to the Show Ring Code of Ethics.

25. Animal Welfare: The Tulsa State Fair is committed to the humane treatment of all animals exhibited. Every possible precaution is taken to insure the animals' safety and well-being. The production practices in the livestock industry are based on good principals of animal husbandry. No one has a greater economic stake in the welfare of animals than the livestock producers and organizations involved in the promotion of agriculture. It is the responsibility of all exhibitors to provide proper and humane care and treatment to animals. Show Management reserves the right to disqualify and remove any exhibitor deemed to be in violation of this basic principle of animal husbandry.

26. Animal Care: All owners or persons in charge of property or livestock shall care for, guard, protect, and preserve same, as the Tulsa State Fair does not undertake to do so, and it shall not be held responsible for any loss, shrinkage, or damage to said property or livestock or the owners or exhibitors thereof. The Tulsa State Fair is not responsible for the acts of third parties.

27. Diseased Animals: No animals carrying a disease of any kind will be admitted onto the Fairgrounds at any time. Show Management has authority to refuse unloading privileges to any livestock showing signs or symptoms of disease.

28. Animal Health Regulations: All livestock must enter through Gate 7. The Tulsa State Fair requires all animals entering the grounds to be accompanied by proper health papers which shall be presented at the time of arrival. Exhibitors agree to read and comply with all the current Oklahoma Health Rules and Regulations. Current Oklahoma Animal Health Rules and Regulations take precedent over this rule, no exceptions.

29. Veterinarian: Pine Ridge Equine Hospital will serve as the official Tulsa State Fair Equine Veterinarian.

30. Unauthorized Animals: Only animals officially entered will be allowed on the show grounds. Any animal(s) brought onto the grounds which is/are NOT entered for competition or exhibition will be removed from the Fairgrounds.

31. Arrivals: All vehicles hauling livestock must use Gate 7 on 15th Street. Health papers will be checked before unloading. **Gate 7 is open from 6:00 a.m. - 10:00 p.m. NO LIVESTOCK WILL BE ALLOWED TO ENTER THE GROUNDS WHILE GATE 7 IS CLOSED.**

32. Releases: Each exhibitor must obtain a written release authorized by Show Management before leaving the property with any animals or trailers. Any exhibitor removing an animal or exhibits before designated release time will be barred from future competition in the Tulsa State Fair, and will forfeit any premiums or award earned.

33. Trailers: All livestock trailers, other than "Show and Go" trailers must be parked in the off-site, secured parking area designated for trailers. No trailers will be allowed to park on the grounds. Exhibitors must have a release to retrieve livestock trailers from the trailer parking area. No animals are permitted to be housed in trailers at the trailer lot.

34. Show and Go Trailers: All "Show and Go" horse trailers must be parked in the reserved lot by Gate 7 on 15th street.

- 35. Stalls:** Stalls will be assigned by the superintendent or their representative. Exhibitors making entries and not exhibiting shall forfeit all fees paid for stalls, pens, entry fees or admission tickets. No stalls will be used for any purpose other than to stall competing livestock. Show Management reserves the right to return entries when the stall numbers are full. Show Management reserves the right to assign any space not occupied by the exhibitor on opening day of the Fair. No exhibitor will be allowed to sublet or sell any space without the written permission of the Management. Horse stalls are 10'x10' and are on asphalt. Stalls must be kept clean and refuse deposited in designated carts.
- 36. Aisles:** Positively no horses are permitted in the center aisle. The center aisle is a pedestrian aisle. All horses will be washed in wash racks only. All bedding must be placed outside the barn. No bedding will be allowed in the center aisle. This rule will be strictly enforced.
- 37. Feed and Bedding:** For your convenience in obtaining feed and bedding, except where animals are bedded on wood chips, a supplier is located on the north end of the Explorer Barn. It is permissible for exhibitors to bring their own feed and/or bedding but absolutely no deliveries, bulk or otherwise, from any other supplier may be made on the grounds during the Tulsa State Fair.
- 38. Sales:** No exhibitor or other shall sell or give away any merchandise or product unless he has purchased space to conduct such sales.
- 39. Generators/Fuel:** Generators and flammable fuels are prohibited on show grounds.
- 40. Schedule:** Show Management reserves the right to cancel or change scheduling when necessary due to unforeseen circumstances.
- 41. Addition/Cancelation of Shows:** Show Management reserves the right to add or cancel a show at their discretion.
- 42. Arena Promptness:** Exhibitors are responsible for knowing the times at which their animals will be judged. Any animal not presented promptly will be ruled ineligible and barred from competition in the class. No complaint or protest on the grounds that the judge overlooked animals will be considered.
- 43. Public Address System:** It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be sure that their animal is at the gate at the appropriate time. Every effort will be made to maintain a working public address system to make class calls. No protest will be upheld, nor will any class be changed on the basis of public address malfunction.
- 44. Show Equipment:** Livestock Shows provide an opportunity for the general public to be exposed to agriculture. Exhibitors should be mindful of the show equipment being use and the manner in which it is being used at all times. Cable halters and pronged chains are prohibited.
- 45. Unmanageable Animals:** The safety of exhibitors and patrons are top priority. Therefore, Show Management may disqualify any animal deemed unmanageable.
- 46. Disqualification of Animal:** Should any animal/entry awarded a prize be disqualified, the lower placing animals/entries will NOT move into the higher position.
- 47. Interfering with Judges:** Any exhibitor or exhibitor's representative who attempts to interfere with a judge or displays disrespect to a judge shall be excluded from competing or exhibiting and forfeit any premiums or awards.
- 48. Judges Decision:** The decisions of a judge shall be final and no appeal will be considered.
- 49. Age of Horses:** The base date for computing age is January 1 of the year foaled.
- 50. Weanling Horses:** Weanling horses have the option of coming in during the day and being released immediately following judging. These horses will not stall unless requested on the entry blank. All other horses must be stalled.
- 51. Premiums:** No exhibitor shall be permitted to win more than two placing in any one class, with the exception of futurities and group classes. Individual animals shown in all the group classes must have been entered and shown in one of the classes for single animals. Where there is no competition, the merits of the animal will determine the award.
- 52. Awards:** The Tulsa State Fair will furnish grand and reserve champion mare, gelding and stallion rosettes and class ribbons in all breed shows. Class trophies are the responsibility of the various breed associations.
- 53. Payment of Premiums:** In paying premiums no evidence of award will be recognized unless the judging results have been properly recorded by the superintendent and signed by the judge. Premiums will be paid by check after the fair. Premium checks will not be issued to exhibitors that did not provide their SSN at the time of entry. All premium checks will be void after 60 days from issue date. Lost premium checks must be reported within 90 days following the fair. No premium checks will be rewritten after 90 days following the fair.
- 54. Objectionable Exhibits:** Show Management reserves the right to remove from the grounds any exhibit, animal, concession or show that may be falsely entered or may be deemed unsuitable or objectionable, or to remove any sign, banner or advertising matter of any kind which may be deemed unsuitable or objectionable by them, without assigning a

reason therefore, and if necessary to return any money already paid for space or stalls, which shall exonerate them from any claim whatsoever on the part of the exhibitor or purchaser.

55. Transportation Methods on Grounds: The use of golf carts, bikes, skateboards, and any other wheeled or motorized mode of transportation is prohibited by exhibitors on the grounds. Pedestrians always have the right of way.

56. Pets or Dogs: No dogs or pets shall be permitted on the Fairgrounds or in exhibit buildings during the Fair except when confined within the campgrounds unless they are part of an authorized act, exhibit or entered in the Cattle Dog Trials or 4-H Dog Show.

57. Smoking: A "no smoking" policy in exhibit buildings will be in effect at the Tulsa State Fair.

58. Liability: In no case shall the Tulsa State Fair, or any of its officers or employees, be held responsible for any loss, damage, tampering, administration of any drug or substance, misuse, sabotage, alteration, injury, death or disability by disease, or from theft, or from any other cause to any such animal or other property, or to any person coming upon said Fairgrounds while said person or property are on the Fairgrounds. The Tulsa State Fair hereby refuses to assume any responsibility for animals or other property brought upon said Fairgrounds, same being brought upon and kept upon said grounds at owner's sole risk. If the property owners or others interested in the property desire protection against loss, damage or injury from fire or any other cause, they must arrange for and pay for such insurance. Each exhibitor is solely responsible for the care, protection and security of their own animals while at the Tulsa State Fair.

59. Claim for Injury: The Tulsa State Fair expressly refuses to assume any liability for injuries to the persons of any of the exhibitors or their officers and employees or to any patrons or other persons coming upon the grounds of the Tulsa State Fair and no claims for injury to any person or property shall ever be asserted or suit instituted or maintained against the Tulsa State Fair, its officers, agents, representatives, or employees for said cause by any person having license or privilege to exhibit on the Fairgrounds or occupying space thereon, and it is a part of the consideration for such license or privilege that such claims for damages are specifically waived. If any damage, loss or injury to person or property shall be proximately caused by reason of negligence or willful act of any person, firm or corporation, or their agents, representatives, servants or employees having license or privilege to exhibit on said Fairgrounds or occupying space thereon, the Tulsa State Fair shall in no manner be liable. All persons causing same or liable therefore shall indemnify the said Tulsa State Fair at Tulsa, Oklahoma.

60. Protests: "Notwithstanding the other rules in this Exhibitor Handbook, contestants and exhibitors may protest the actions of other contestants and exhibitors." All protest must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$500.00, which deposit will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Said protest must be filed with the Show Management within five hours after the award was made, it being considered that award was made when ribbon or premium card is placed. Appeals must contain at least one specific charge stating at length the facts or the rule violated, and naming witnesses and their addresses to substantiate the charge. In addition to the right of protest therein guaranteed to exhibitors, the Management reserves the right to take cognizance of fraud consummated or attempted in connection with an animal and take such action as may be deemed just and proper. All questions or disputes or differences not provided for under these rules shall be referred to the Management, whose decision shall be final.

61. Appeals: No complaint or appeal based upon the statement that the judge or judges are incompetent or have overlooked an animal or article will be considered by the Management. The right of an exhibitor to appeal from the decisions of a judge to the Management will lie only when it is charged that the award has been made in violation of the rules governing the exhibit; or when it is charged that the decision of the judges has been influenced or interfered with by another. All questions or disputes or differences not provided for under these rules shall be referred to the Management, whose decision shall be final.

SPECIAL RULES

1. **Sanctioning:** All horses are subject to the rules and regulations set up by the Oklahoma Draft Horse and Mule Association and the Tulsa State Fair.
2. **Divisions: This year we are offering three Divisions**
 - a. Draft Horse
 - b. Horse Pony/Draft Cross/Mule/Driving Horses 14 Hands and Above
 - c. Pony/Mule 13.3 Hands or Under
3. **Fees:**

Horse (Stall Fee) -----	\$50.00
Tack Stall (if available) -----	\$50.00
Class Entry Fee -----	\$20.00
Unicorn & Four Horse Hitch Class Fee -----	\$30.00
Six Horse Hitch Class Fee -----	\$50.00
4. **Registration Papers:** A copy of registration papers must be sent on all registered horses. If no papers are sent and horse is entered in halter class, it will be entered in the gelding class. First place mares, stallions and geldings of all breeds to combine for Grand/Reserve Mare, Stallion and Gelding.
5. **Arrivals:** All vehicles hauling livestock must use Gate 7 on 15th Street. Health papers will be checked before unloading. Gate 7 is open from 6:00 a.m. - 10:00 p.m. no livestock will be allowed to enter the grounds while gate 7 is closed.
6. **Stalling:** All horses must stall and pay a stall fee per each horse.
7. **Call for Classes:** Contestants will receive 3 calls per class. After the 3rd call, the gates will close. No exceptions.
8. **Animal & Equipment Condition:** All animals, wagons and harness should be in clean and good condition.
9. **Exhibitor Conduct:** All exhibitors and assistants should be dressed appropriately. Each exhibitor must wear the correct number for that class. The number may be attached to person or cart or wagon.
10. **Show Ring Conduct:** No person shall be permitted in the ring during the time of judging of classes except the judge, ring steward, exhibitor and one groom or header for each driving class as needed.
11. **Hitch Classes:** The hitch classes are considered group classes. More than one owner may participate in a hitch class but only one owner should make the entry and pay the entry fee for the team. Only one driver is permitted in any of the classes. One rider is optional.
12. **Logging, Gamblers Choice, Scurry, and Driving Obstacle Classes:**
 - a. May use farm harness or scotch collars.
 - b. No manes or tails braided.
 - c. Exhibitor must furnish fore cart or two-wheel cart for the gamblers choice single or team obstacle.
13. **Hitch Class:**
 - a. An adult must ride with any junior driver.
 - b. Show hitches must have a fifth wheel wagon.
14. **Six Horse Hitch Class:** Is a qualifying show for the North American Six Horse Hitch Competition. A minimum of \$2500 will be paid for the class. Six horse hitch entrants must be members of the North American Six Horse Hitch Association. In addition, the Oklahoma Draft Horse & Mule Association is assisting all six horse hitch exhibitors with travel expense based upon the following:
 - a. \$150 for travel up to 150 miles
 - b. \$200 for travel up to 250 miles
 - c. \$275 for travel up to 251 or more miles
 - d. Semis will be parked outside the Super Duty Barn under the direction of the superintendent.

15. **Course:** Obstacle course layouts will be given out at exhibitor meeting. A walkthrough will be held before each obstacle event.
16. **Costume Classes:** Theme to be "OCCUPATION": A 2 or 4-wheel vehicle may be driven. (Does not have to be antique vehicle.) A horse may be ridden or walked. Farm or show harness may be used. All costumes should be theme related.
17. **Pleasure Driving Classes:** Does not require show harness, shoes, or braids.
18. **Draft Cross Horses:** Draft crosses over 16 hands will be shown with Draft horses. Draft Crosses under 16 hands will show in the Draft pony/Mule classes.
19. **Exhibitor Meeting:** Draft Horse Show participants are encouraged to attend a meeting at the ODHMA Hospitality Booth Friday, October 6, 9:00 a.m.
20. **Junior Drivers:** Junior drivers must be between the ages of 8 and 17.

Draft Horse Pull Rules and Regulations TWO CLASS OVER WEIGHT
