Released: Barrows, except those selected for the Junior Livestock Auction, will be released upon conclusion of their breed show. Must be out by 9:00 p.m. on Wednesday, October 5.

Entry Deadline: Entry and payment must be submitted online by September 1, 2016, 12:00 midnight. Legal Release Form and Online Receipt must be postmarked mailed and by September 2, 2016. Nomination does not constitute entry.

Processing Fee: \$15.00

SPECIAL RULES

1. The Tulsa State Fair Junior Market Barrow Show is a non-terminal show, with the exception of the Junior Livestock Auction barrows.
2. **Read General Rules:** All junior exhibitors are expected to adhere to the General Rules, Show Ring Code of Ethics, and Health and Sanitary Regulations in the front of this book as well as the Junior General Rules and Regulations.
3. **Nominations:** Market barrows showing at the Tulsa State Fair must have nomination information submitted online and mail DNA sample to the Tulsa State Fair office postmarked by July 1, 2016. For junior market animal nomination and entry procedure, please refer to Junior General Rules and Regulations and the Nomination page on the Tulsa State Fair website.
4. **Retag:** There will be a \$5.00 retag fee at the time of check-in if you have not retagged before the show.
5. **Show Limit:** Exhibitors may exhibit three (3) barrows. Each exhibitor may exhibit in three (3) different breeds. However, any one barrow may not enter or show in two different breeds.
6. **Ownership:** All barrows must be owned, cared for daily and fed by the exhibitor from July 1 and must meet all Barrow Show Classification Standards as established by the Breed Associations. No pedigrees will be required.
7. **Ear Notch:** All purebred barrows must have healed ear notches on both ears.
8. **Weigh-In:**
 - a. There will be no official weigh-in of Market Barrows. Courtesy scales will be available for hog weigh-in.
 - b. Each exhibitor will be responsible for declaring his/her animal's weight and providing the weight to the Superintendent on the "Kiosk Check-in" before 8:00 p.m., Monday, October 3 for all breeds showing on Tuesday, October 4 and before 9:00 a.m., Tuesday, October 4 for breeds showing on Wednesday, October 5. This weight will be declared class weight. Show classification weight will range from 230 to 280 pounds. Barrows entered outside of the weight range will be disqualified.
 - c. Courtesy scales in the Explorer Barn will be provided for weighing daily from 7:00 a.m. until 11:00 p.m. Scales will be calibrated by show officials daily. Weighing on the official scales in the show ring will not be permitted.
 - d. The show Superintendent will weigh barrows prior to entering the main show ring. Any barrow which weighs more than 10 pounds from weight listed on Official Show Weight Card will be disqualified.
9. **Class Breaks:** Class breaks will be determined by show management. Every effort will be made not to put more than 35 head per class. Large breeds may be broken into divisions.
10. **Arena Promptness:** Each barrow must be driven into the judging ring promptly when called.
11. **Class:** If an animal is exhibited in the wrong class that entry will be disqualified. After the judge enters the main show arena, after sifting the class, no other entry will be accepted in class.
12. **Grooming:** Only water will be permitted in the holding area. No color grooming compound will be allowed. Hair will be checked before the animals enter the show ring. Presence of color will disqualify the entry.
13. **Stalling:** Pens will be pre-assigned by the designated superintendent by FFA Chapter and 4-H County. No pens will be built outside of barn. No washing outside of barn. Divider panels are not provided by the show. You will need to bring your own divider panels and means to secure. Management reserved the right to reassign unused pens or tack pens to pen animals.
14. **Restraint:** No Barrow will be restrained with a nose snare.
15. **Injured Animal:** When the judge determines that an animal can no longer compete without endangering itself, said animal will be disqualified, and the next highest placing animal in that class or preliminary sale order will be brought in to replace the injured animal.
16. **Selection of Junior Livestock Auction:** The number of barrows that qualify for the sale will be based on the total number of barrows entered in the show. No less than 40 and no more than 45 barrows will be selected for the sale. The number of barrows selected by the judge in each breed for the premium sale will be on a percentage basis of the total number shown. The minimum number of head for a breed to have at least one animal eligible for the sale is equal to the total number of head exhibited, divided by sale spots, and then rounded to the nearest whole number. Breeds that have less than the minimum number of head, but more than 15 will show for breed champion honors only and only the champion will show for sale order with the crossbreds. Breeds with less than 15 will show as crossbreds. Example: In 2015 a total of 987 barrows were exhibited. To get the required number per breed, you would take the total number divided by 45, ($987/45 = 21.933$), then round to the nearest whole number, (22). In order for any breed to have a

guaranteed spot in the sale, that breed would have to have at least 22 animals exhibited. If there were only 21 animals, the champion and only the champion of that breed would show for sale order with the crossbreds.

17. **Junior Livestock Auction Meeting:** There will be a gathering for all Junior Auction participants immediately following the barrow show at the Swine Arena. It is a requirement that each Junior Auction participant be present. Any and all instructions concerning the Junior Auction will be given at this time. The Swine Committee will be available in the Junior Livestock Auction Area to answer any questions or be of any help to the exhibitor Thursday.

18. **PQA Requirements:** Exhibitors will not be required to complete Pork Quality Assurance (PQA) or PQA Plus prior to the 2016 Tulsa State Fair; however all exhibitors are encouraged to do so. As an incentive to participate in PQA Plus training programs, the Oklahoma Pork Council, (okPORK), will enter all exhibitors entered in the TSF Swine Shows who are current in Youth PQA plus in a drawing for a chance to win 2 iPads AND will enter FFA Instructors and 4-H Extension Agents who conduct the PQA Plus training programs and have students entered in the Tulsa State Fair Swine Shows in a drawing for 2 \$500 Visa Gift Cards. In addition, the okPORK will only purchase barrows in the Junior Livestock Auction if the exhibitor was current in PQA Plus certification on July 1, 2016.

19. **Classification:** The Tulsa State Fair has chosen to accept the classification standards as specified by the National Swine Breed Association 2016 Junior Market Livestock Show for the purpose of determining breed characteristics. Barrows who do not meet the Barrow Classification Standards will not be eligible to compete in the Tulsa State Fair Jr. Market Barrow Show. Barrows classified as a purebred breed that does not meet the classification standards can move to the crossbred division. The barrow will only be moved into the crossbred division and not into another breed section. Barrows nominated as a crossbred will not be permitted to move into another breed.

20. **Premiums:** 1st - \$50, 2nd - \$45, 3rd - \$40, 4th - \$35, 5th - \$35, 6th - \$30, 7th - \$25, 8th - \$25, 9th - \$20, 10th - \$20

SPECIAL - The National Swine Registry will offer \$5,000 to the Grand Champion Barrow of the junior market hog show if this animal is a registered Duroc, Hampshire, or Yorkshire barrow. The exhibitor must have a transferred pedigree of the Grand Champion Barrow and must present it to the NSR representative at the time of exhibition. This barrow must submit to a DNA verification test. A representative of the National Swine Registry must be present at the time of DNA sampling.

SPECIAL - The National Swine Registry will offer \$2,500 to the Reserve Grand Champion Barrow of the junior market hog show if this animal is a registered Duroc, Hampshire, or Yorkshire barrow. The exhibitor must have a transferred pedigree of the Reserve Grand Champion Barrow and must present it to the NSR representative at the time of exhibition. This barrow must submit to a DNA verification test. A representative of the National Swine Registry must be present at the time of DNA sampling.

BARROW CLASSIFICATION STANDARDS

These are the recognized breeds for the Tulsa State Fair

DIVISION 250 — BERKSHIRE

1. A black and white animal with erect ears exhibiting Berkshire character.
2. A Berkshire must have white on all four legs, face and tail (unless tail is docked).
3. Must be ear notched within seven days of birth.
4. A Berkshire must NOT have a solid white or a solid black face from the ears forward.
5. A Berkshire must NOT have a solid black nose (rim of nose).
6. White is allowed on the ears, but NO solid white may appear on the ears.
7. One occasional splash of white may appear only on the lower one-half of the body.

DIVISION 251 — CHESTER WHITE

1. Must possess Chester White Breed characteristics.
2. Must be ear notched within seven days of birth.
3. Must be solid white in color, no color on the skin larger than a silver dollar, no colored hair.
4. Any skin pigmentation other than white that exceeds five in number is disqualified.
5. Ears must be down and medium size.
6. Any signs of weighted ear tags or evidence of past existence of such ear tags are determined to be not permissible and are grounds for disqualification.

DIVISION 252 — DUROC

1. Must be red in color and possess Duroc Breed Character. (ears must be down and medium size).
2. Must be ear notched within seven days of birth.
3. Must NOT have any white hair located on the animal.
4. Must NOT have any black hair.
5. Must NOT have more than three black spots on the skin and none of these spots can be larger than two inches in diameter.
6. Must NOT have any shading or indication of a belt.

DIVISION 253 — HAMPSHIRE

1. Must be black in color with a white belt starting on the front leg. The belt may partially or totally encircle the body.
2. Must possess Hampshire Breed character (ears must be erect and not rounded).
3. Must be ear notched within seven days of birth.
4. Must NOT have any white hair or indications of streaking on the forehead.
5. Must NOT have any red hair.

DIVISION 254 — POLAND CHINA

1. Must possess Poland China Breed character.
2. Must be ear notched within seven days of birth.
3. Must be black with six white points (face, feet and tail) with an occasional splash of white on the body. A hog may not possess more than one black leg and be determined as a Poland China. (Tail docking is permissible eliminating that white point.)
4. Must have ears down.
5. Must NOT have evidence of belt formation.
6. Cannot have any red or sandy hair and/or pigment.
7. Hogs that have weighted ear tags or evidence of tampering with possible ear tags are ineligible.

DIVISION 255 — SPOTTED

1. Must be black and white.
2. Must possess Spotted Breed character.
3. Must be ear notched within seven days of birth.
4. Ears cannot be erect.
5. Any red tinted or brown spots are ineligible.
6. No solid black head from ears forward.
7. No distinct white belt pattern (hair or skin) encircling and extending down and onto each shoulder.
8. Any signs of weighted ear tags or evidence of past existence of such tags are determined to be not permissible and are grounds for disqualification.

DIVISION 256 — YORKSHIRE

1. Must be white in color and possess Yorkshire Breed character. (ears must be erect)
2. Must be ear notched within seven days of birth.
3. Must NOT have any colored hair other than white.
4. Must NOT have colored skin pigmentation larger than one U.S. minted silver dollar.
5. Must NOT have masking above the eyes larger than a silver dollar.

DIVISION 257 — CROSSBRED

1. Any barrow that does not classify into a breed listed.
