RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. **SHOW SCHEDULE:** Heifers will show on the following days in the order listed:

2. **AGE REQUIREMENTS:** All heifers must have been born on or after September 1, 2008 but not later than May 1, 2010.
3. **READ GENERAL RULES:** Junior exhibitors are expected to adhere to the General Rules and Regulations in the front of this book as well as the General Rules and Regulations governing the Junior Division.
4. **SHOW LIMITS:** Each exhibitor can only show a total of two head, regardless of the number of head entered. Each exhibitor may exhibit two breeds. Any one animal may not show in two different breeds.
5. **OWNERSHIP:** All heifers must have been owned, fed and cared for daily by the exhibitor no later than August 1, 2010.
6. **REGISTRATION PAPERS:** All entries in the purebred heifer show must be registered and recorded solely in the name of the individual exhibitor no later than August 1, 2010. Exhibitors must have original registration papers to present to superintendent (no exception). All heifers without papers must be shown in the Commercial Heifer division.
7. **TATTOOS:** Tattoos must be in the ear of the heifers and may be checked by breed representatives. Tattoo must be legible or the animal will be declared ineligible. Please check your tattoos at the time of entry to ensure accurate entry information.
8. **BRED & OWNED:** The bred and owned class is to identify and recognize those junior exhibitors who have bred and raised their own beef heifers. To be eligible for the bred and owned class, the breeder and the owner of the animal must be the same. Registration papers will serve as proof for entering the class. Breed representatives will verify the breeder with the respective national organization should any question arise. All females eligible for the bred-and-owned class will show in their respective class prior to competing for the bred-and-owned awards. All ages will show together in the bred-and-owned class. Bred and owned must be indicated at the time of check in.
9. **HAIR:** No alteration or simulation with respect to color or hair will be permitted on any Junior animals. (This includes all products, natural or man-made). If alteration or addition is detected by a show official or through a protest, the exhibitor, organized group, or individual involved will be disqualified and barred from exhibiting for one year.
10. **SUPREME HEIFER:** On Sunday, October 10, 2010, at the conclusion of every Junior Heifer Show, there will be a Supreme Champion, Reserve Supreme Champion and Third Best Overall heifers chosen. Every breed champion, reserve breed champion and third best heifer is eligible and must stay to participate. If a breed champion or reserve breed champion does not stay to participate, management holds the right to withhold all premiums from the exhibitor. Breeds recognized in the Supreme Heifer selection are as follows: Angus, American Breed, Braunvieh, Braunvieh Beefbuilder, Charolais, Chianina, Chianina Influence, Commercial, Gelbvieh, Hereford, Limousin, Maine, Maintainer, Red Angus, Saler, Shorthorn, Shorthorn Plus, Simmental, and Simmental Influence, Commercial.
11. **GROOMING CHUTES:** Due to limited space, ONLY 1 grooming chute for every 5 junior heifer entries, per 4-H & FFA County will be permitted on the TSF grounds. Grooming chute passes may be purchased for \$30 at the time of entry. Due to safety issues, grooming chutes will ONLY be permitted in the stall area. No grooming chutes allowed in the aisles or outside of the Oklahoma Ford Dealers Barn and the Expedition Barn. Purchase of a chute pass does not guarantee stall space for chutes

- 12. **GENERATORS:** No generators allowed in the Barn or parking area.
- 13. **NO HEIFERS WILL BE ALLOWED TO TIE IN THE ARENA, SURROUNDING THE BLEACHERS OR THE CABLE LINE.**
- 14. **CLASS BREAKS:** Classes for each breed of beef heifers will be made up according to the number of head showing in each breed. Not more than 10 head will be shown in each group. The method of breaking the total number of head in a breed into age classifications at the Fair was designed to be an incentive to create a better and larger show for this Junior Division Heifer Show. With your help and continued support we are sure it will be a positive step in reaching our goal of the Best Heifer Show in the Nation.

SECTION 220 - AMERICAN BREEDS

All American breeds represented: Beefmaster, Brahman, Brangus, Santa Gertrudis, and Five Star Santa Gertrudis. Each breed listed will compete for the Champion American Heifer. The Champion and Reserve Champion American Heifer will be required to participate in the Supreme Champion Heifer Selection.

SECTION 220A — BEEFMASTER

The Junior Beefmaster Breeders Association (IBBA), appropriates one-half the total cash premiums for the Beefmaster classes. Total premiums to be paid directly from the Tulsa State Fair. This show shall abide by the IBBA Approved Heifer Show Rules. Exhibitors must be a member of the Junior Beefmaster Breeders Association. All heifers must be registered with Beefmaster Breeders United as a purebred and out of a BBU-Certified Purebred dam, Second Cross dam or as otherwise stated in the BBU By-Laws. All heifers shall be inspected to ensure that all identification numbers and holding brands branded or tattooed on the animal and the description match identically with the BBU Certificate of Breeding. Original BBU Certificates of Breeding (not copies) on each animal, including any calf-at-side, must be presented to a representative of the show at the time the cattle arrive on the premises. Application for a BBU Certificate of Breeding on calves under 30 days of age will be accepted. Animals shall be shown with their hair coats laying downward in a natural state that is flat to the entire body, which includes the legs as well as the tail. No animal shall be shown that has any foreign objects glued to or otherwise attached or its natural hair color altered in a manner to change conformation or appearance.

SECTION 220B — BRAHMAN

The heifers must be registered in the American Brahman Breeders Association in the name of the exhibitor to be eligible. Heifers must comply with the ownership rule of the Tulsa State Fair. Registration papers are subject to inspection by the breed representative. The Tulsa State Fair will pay 50% of the premiums and the Oklahoma Junior Brahman Association will pay 50%, but all premiums will be paid to exhibitors by the Tulsa State Fair.

SECTION 220C – BRANGUS

The Oklahoma Junior Brangus Breeders Association will sponsor 35% of the premiums. The Tulsa State Fair will sponsor 65% of the premiums. All heifers must be registered in the name of the exhibitor and registration papers are subject to inspection by the Superintendent or Association representatives. Heifers must comply with the ownership rule of the Tulsa State Fair. Exhibitors must be members of the Oklahoma Junior Brangus Breeders Association. All exhibits are subject to IBBA regulations of eligibility and inspection. Only original registration certificates will be accepted for check-in. No copies or faxes will be accepted. All premiums will be paid directly from the Tulsa State Fair.

SECTION 220D - SANTA GERTRUDIS

The Arkoma Santa Gertrudis Association will furnish \$100 of the total premiums. The heifer must be registered in the name of the Junior member; this Junior member must feed, fit, care for, and show the animal entered. All heifers must be individually identified by tattoo or numerical fire brand or freeze brand. Each heifer must be registered in the name of the Junior exhibitor.

All premiums will be paid to exhibitors by the Tulsa State Fair. The Arkoma Santa Gertrudis Breeders Association will furnish the Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Heifer trophies. All exhibitors must comply with the rules and regulations of the Santa Gertrudis Breeders International Association.

SECTION 220E - STAR FIVE SANTA GERTRUDIS

The Arkoma Santa Gertrudis Association will furnish \$100 of the total premiums. The heifer must be 50/87% and registered in the name of the Junior member; this Junior member must feed, fit, care for, and show the animal entered. All heifers must be individually identified by tattoo or numerical fire brand or freeze brand. Each heifer must be registered in the name of the Junior exhibitor. All premiums will be paid to exhibitors by the Tulsa State Fair. The Arkoma Santa Gertrudis Breeders Association will furnish the Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Heifer trophies. All exhibitors must comply with the rules and regulations of the Santa Gertrudis Breeders International Association.

SECTION 221 — ANGUS

Fitting rule (Rule 11) - The American Angus Association Board of Directors at their regular meeting in June, 2004 adopted Rule 11 that is applicable to all Angus shows in which the American Angus Association participates. Effective July, 2004: At any show for which the American Angus Association appropriates funds toward the payment of premiums, no exhibitors, individuals assisting exhibitors or member owners at such show shall be allowed to use any coloring agents, on any animal exhibited. The Association may adopt and implement various tests designed to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to a "white towel" or "white glove" test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated make up areas.

The American Angus Association, 3201 Frederick Avenue, St. Joseph, Missouri, will pay 20% of the total premiums in individual classes offered for Junior Angus Heifers as included in its standard show classification where individual premiums amount to \$5 or more. The Association contributions will be included in the premium checks issued by the TSF. **To be eligible for Association premiums heifer entries must be recorded in the sole name of the Junior exhibitor and the issue date on the registration certificate must conform to the individual show's requirements regarding ownership.** The Association's contribution is included in the total premiums listed in each class. Premiums from the Association are paid by registration number. Therefore, all cattle should be registered at the time of entry to make certain they receive the Association's portion of premiums. The Association does not pay a percentage on premiums offered in championship classes. **Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate on each animal available for inspection at the show. Ownership for Angus heifers goes by date of issue, not date of sale.**

Any animal upon check-in which does not have a legible tattoo corresponding to its registration certificate is ineligible to show. (Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible tattoo, animals cannot be re-tattooed and rechecked at the show. Only one person at a time shall lead animals into the show ring.

Any product administered internally or used externally to alter the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), use of graphite, powders, hemp or other similar substances externally and steroids, growth stimulants or artificial filling internally. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing. The exhibition of cattle displaying false hair will not be allowed, with the exception of false tail switches.

For an exhibitor to be eligible at shows for premium monies contributed by the American Angus Association, each exhibitor is subject to Part 3, Section IX of the Association's rules entitled "Eligibility, Conformation and Structure of Animals Presented for Exhibition". DNA FOR PARENTAGE VERIFICATION. Under the Association Rules each animal for which entry application (registration) is received, may be subjected to a DNA test to verify both ACCURACY OF PARENTAGE AND DNA as covered under Association Rules Part 3, Section II, Rule 2(F). Staff of the American Angus Association must supervise the collection of DNA samples. Animals are often sampled at shows, fairs or events where the American Angus Association contributes premiums or where Association personnel participate. If a recorded parent is excluded (as a parent) as a result of DNA, the owner may request, at his own expense, the Association to determine the actual parent. Failure to determine the sire and dam disqualifies the animal's eligibility in the Angus Herd Book, and the registration certificate becomes null and void. The American Angus Association appropriates one-half of the total cash premiums for the Angus classes. Total premiums will be paid directly from the The Tulsa State Fair.

SECTION 222 – BRAUNVIEH

Tulsa State Fair will sponsor 65% and Oklahoma Braunvieh Breeders will sponsor 35%. All premiums will be paid to the exhibitors by the Tulsa State Fair. Oklahoma Braunvieh Breeders sponsors the showmanship awards. All heifers must be Full Blood or Purebred Braunvieh and be recorded in the Braunvieh Association of America and the sole name of the exhibitor. Exhibitor must be a member of the Braunvieh Association of America. The date of sale must be recorded on the registration papers and must have taken on or before August 1, 2010. Heifers must have a legible tattoo and correspond with the registration papers. They are subject to inspection by the Superintendent. Heifers born prior to October 9, 2008 must be accompanied by an affidavit from a licensed veterinarian stating the female is safe with calf.

SECTION 223 – BRAUNVIEH BEEF BUILDER OR PERCENTAGE

Open to all Braunvieh percentage 1/4 to 3/4 blood that are registered with the Braunvieh Association of America in the name of the exhibitor. Classes will be divided after arrival and check in. All rules from Section 236 - Braunvieh above apply in this section. Premiums and awards will be the same as in the Braunvieh show.

SECTION 224 – CHAROLAIS

The Oklahoma Charolais Association will pay 25% of the premiums in the following classes. The rules of the American International Charolais Association governing Junior Charolais Heifer Classes will be strictly followed. All animals to be eligible for Junior Charolais Heifer Classes must be purebred and registered with AICA. Copies of registration papers will not be accepted. The Oklahoma Charolais Association will pay \$50.00 to the Champion Charolais Heifer and will pay \$25.00 to the Reserve Champion Heifer. All premiums will be paid directly from the TSF.

SECTION 228 – HEREFORD HORNED/POLLED

This section is open to Hereford heifers (horned and polled). The heifer must be registered solely and only in the name of the individual junior exhibitor in the records of the American Hereford Association. Heifers and registration papers will be checked by the Breed Superintendent or Association representative.

Junior Hereford exhibitors MUST be members of the Junior Hereford Association of Oklahoma; membership may be started or renewed at the show check-in table. An exhibitor's conduct is governed by both the Tulsa State Fair and the American Hereford Association (AHA). AHA rules and regulations are available online.

AHA Rules and Regulations at Section VII, Rule 4 states in part; "The Association may require that any animal for which entry application is received or which has been registered by the Association be subjected to a DNA profile test to verify accuracy of the recorded parentage. The AHA Executive Committee of the Board of Directors is empowered to determine who shall pay the costs of any investigation, including laboratory fees assessed under the provisions of this rule". AHA Rules and Regulations, Section III, rule 25 and Section IV, rule 12 cover fraud and misrepresentation.

The Oklahoma Hereford Association will pay 30% of the premiums listed below to the Tulsa State Fair. All premiums will be paid to exhibitors by the Tulsa State Fair. Classes and divisions will be broken at the discretion of the superintendents according to the number of head checked in and natural age breaks. Any additional classes made by the superintendents over the number allotted by the Fair will be funded by the OHA 100%.

SECTION 229 – LIMOUSIN

The Oklahoma Limousin Breeders Association will pay 20% of the total premiums. Heifers must comply with the ownership rule of the Tulsa State Fair. Heifers must be purebred or percentage of 75% or higher Limousin (NALF %, not actual) with orange papers. All purple papered Lim-Flex are eligible to show. Heifers must be recorded with the North American Limousin Foundation in the name of the exhibitor. Tattoo must correspond to registration certificate. Tattoos and registration papers will be checked at the show. Ownership rule will be strictly enforced. Heifer exhibitor must be a member of Oklahoma Junior Limousin Association. SECTION 233 – SALERS

Tulsa State Fair and the Oklahoma Salers Association are co-sponsors of the Salers Junior Heifer Show. All heifers must be 75.1% Salers or more and recorded with the American Salers Association in the sole name of the exhibitor. Heifers must be legibly tattooed and correspond with the registration certificate and must comply with the rules of the Tulsa State Fair. Heifers and registration papers are subject to inspection by the Superintendent or Association representatives.

Any or all heifers may be subject to parental verification. If the sire and dam cannot be verified, no premium or prize money will be awarded. Blood typing will be done by the American Salers Association regulations. A percentage heifer class to include heifers 50% to 75% Salers and recorded with the American Salers Association in the sole name of the exhibitor has been added. Heifers must be legibly tattooed and correspond with the registration certificate and must comply with the rules of the Tulsa State Fair. Percentage class heifers will not be included in any other competition, i.e. Division Champions & Bred & Owned.

Percentage heifers will exhibit as one class. Oklahoma Salers Association will reimburse 100% of the premiums paid in the Percentage Heifer class and will reimburse 50% of the premiums in the Saler Heifer classes paid by the Tulsa State Fair

Classes will be broken as evenly and equally as possible, depending on the ages of the entries. Exhibitors must be members of the Oklahoma Junior Simmental Simbrah Association. All females 18 months of age or older must be certified pregnant by a licensed non-owner vet, or have certification that she has been used in an E.T. program. To be eligible to show, all heifers must have legible tattoos that correspond exactly to their papers, only one tattoo in a calf's ear. **Ownership for Simmental Heifers goes by date of issue not date of sale. Ownership must have taken place by August 1, 2010.** Only original papers will be accepted. The OSSA reserves the right to DNA test any female in the purebred shows. If exhibitors do not comply with DNA testing, the exhibitor and animal will not be eligible to show in any OSSA sanctioned show. Purebred heifers must be recorded with the ASA in the name of the exhibitor, 3/4 bloods and above will show in the Purebred Simmental show. *Showmanship contests are no fit. The Oklahoma Simmental Association will pay 50% of the total premiums. All premiums will be paid to exhibitors by the Tulsa State Fair.

Classes will be broken as evenly and equally as possible, depending on the ages of the entries. Exhibitors must be members of the Oklahoma Junior Simmental Simbrah Association. All females 18 months of age or older must be certified pregnant by a licensed non-owner vet, or have certification that she has been used in an E.T. program. To be eligible to show all heifers must have legible tattoos that correspond exactly to their papers, only one tattoo in a calf's ear. **Ownership for Simmental Influence Heifers goes by date of issue not date of sale. Ownership must have taken place by August 1, 2010.** Only original papers will be accepted. The OSSA reserves the right to DNA test any female in the influence shows. If exhibitors do not comply with DNA testing, the exhibitor and animal will not be eligible to show in any OSSA sanctioned show. All influence females registerable with the ASA below 3/4 blood will be eligible. The eligible heifers must be registered in the name of the exhibitor with the ASA. The Oklahoma Simmental Association will pay 50% of the total premiums. All premiums will be paid to exhibitors by the Tulsa State Fair

SECTION 238 - COMMERCIAL BREEDING

Heifers of mixed or composite breeding and heifers of purebred breeding without registration papers. Registered heifers of breeds which **DO NOT** have a breed sponsored show at the Tulsa State Fair may also show in the Commercial Heifer Division. Registered heifers that fail to qualify for their breed show may qualify to show in the Commercial Heifer Division **ONLY** if the Exhibitor can prove date of ownership, date of birth of the heifer, and providing they meet all other requirements of the Tulsa State Fair

Requirements for entering a Commercial Heifer:

- 1) All entries will be made online using the Tulsa State Fair Entry form. A copy of the entry form must be submitted along with the following items for the entry for be complete.
- 2) Commercial Heifer Ownership Statement (available on TSF website) signed by either the Agricultural Education Instructor or 4-H County Extension Educator and the exhibitor attesting to ownership of the heifer on or before August 1, 2010 or - Copy of Registration Paper
- 3) Photo of exhibitor and heifer (photos, polaroid's, print-out of digital photos are all accepted) - or - Copy of Registration Papers. A side profile picture of the heifer's right profile with the exhibitor in photo must be submitted with entry. Exhibitor name and heifer ID must be written on the back of photo.
- 4) Exhibitor must also submit the Tulsa State Fair Legal Release and entry fee payment. All required material should be mailed to the Tulsa State Fair.
- 5) Keep a photocopy of all entry documents!

Requirements at time of check - in at the fair:

- 1) Exhibitor and heifer must be present at check - in time
- 2) Exhibitor must have a copy of the Ownership Documentation form or Registration Papers plus a photo with them at check - in. (see #5 above)
- 3) ALL TATTOOS will be checked at the fair check - in. **Any heifer who fails to have a tattoo or whose tattoo differs from the one submitted on the Ownership Documentation Form or on registration papers will be disqualified.** Please check your tattoo before leaving home to ensure it matches your documents.

Commercial Heifer classes will be split by date of birth. The champion and reserve champion commercial heifer will be included in the Supreme Heifer drive. All decisions of superintendents with regard to class breaks and classification are final - no protests will be entertained. Premium money will be paid by the TSF.
