Judging: Wednesday, October 6, 12:00 noon. in the following order:

Duroc, Yorksire, Berkshire, Poland China, Spotted, Chester White & OPB

** Above breeds must have cards turned in Tuesday, October 5 before 8:00 p.m.*

Judging: Thursday, October 7, 8:00 a.m. in the following order: Hampshire & Crossbred

** Above breeds must have cards turned in Wednesday, October 6 before 9:00 a.m.*

Entry Deadline: Junior Entries must be submitted online by **August 27, 2010**. Legal Release Form, Signed Receipt, and Payment must be mailed in and postmarked by **September 3, 2010**. Nomination does not constitute entry.

Late Entries: Entries not received prior to August 27, 2010, are able to enter until **September 17, 2010** for triple the fees.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

All changes to the rules for 2010 are in bold print

1. The Tulsa State Fair Junior Market Barrow Show is a non-terminal show.
2. **READ GENERAL RULES:** All junior exhibitors are expected to adhere to the General Rules, Show Ring Code of Ethics, and Health and Sanitary Regulations in the front of this book as well as the Rules and Regulations governing the Junior Division.
3. **NOMINATIONS:** All barrows showing at the Tulsa State Fair must mail in nomination packets to the Tulsa State Fair office postmarked by July 1, 2010. Nominations packets must include ear tag #, DNA sample, and nomination form. Nomination packets must be obtained from 4-H Extension Educator or FFA Instructor. For Junior Market Animal Nomination and Entry Procedure, please refer to page # 92, rule # 43-49 in the General Junior Rules and Regulations and the Nomination page on the Tulsa State Fair website.
4. **ARRIVAL:** All Junior Market Barrows must be in place no later than 10:00 p.m., Tuesday, October 5.
5. **RELEASE:** Junior Market Barrows will be released at the conclusion of the show.
6. **SHOW LIMITS:** Exhibitors may enter and exhibit three (3) barrows. Each exhibitor may exhibit in three (3) different breeds. However, any one barrow may not enter or show in two different breeds.
7. **OWNERSHIP:** All barrows must be owned, cared for daily and fed by the exhibitor from July 1 and must meet all Barrow Show Classification Standards as established by the Breed Associations. No pedigrees will be required.
8. **EAR NOTCHES:** All purebred barrows must have healed ear notches on both ears.
9. **WEIGH-IN:**
 - a. There will be no official weigh-in of Market Barrows. Official scales will be available for hog weigh-in.
 - b. Each exhibitor will be responsible for declaring his/her animal's weight and providing the weight to the Superintendent on the "Official Show Weight Card" before 8:00 p.m., Tuesday, October 5 for all breeds showing on Wednesday, October 6 and before 9:00 a.m., Wednesday, October 6 for breeds showing on Thursday, October 7. This weight will be declared class weight. Show classification weight will range from 230 to 280 pounds. Barrows weighing below 230 pounds will not be allowed to show.
 - c. Courtesy scales in the Explorer Barn will be provided for weighing daily from 7:00 a.m. until 11:00 p.m. Scales will be calibrated by show officials daily. Weighing on the official scales in the show ring will not be permitted.
 - d. The show Superintendent will weigh at least the top 5 barrows. Any barrow which weighs more than 10 pounds from weight listed on Official Show Weight Card, will be disqualified.
10. **CLASS BREAKS:** Class breaks will be determined by show management. Every effort will be made not to put more than 40 head per class. Large breeds may be broken into divisions.
11. Each barrow must be driven into the judging ring promptly when called.
12. If an animal is exhibited in the wrong class that entry will be disqualified. After the judge enters the main show arena, after sifting the class, no other entry will be accepted in class.
13. **GROOMING:** Only water will be permitted in the holding area. No color grooming compound will be allowed. Hair will be checked before the animals enter the show ring. Presence of color will disqualify the entry. These grooming rules apply for the duration of the Junior Division of the Tulsa State Fair and apply to both sexes, all species.

- 14. **STALLING:** Pens will be assigned by the designated superintendent by FFA Chapter and 4-H Club. No pens will be built outside of barn. **NO WASHING OUTSIDE OF BARN.**
- 15. No Barrow will be restrained with a nose snare.
- 16. **VIOLATION OF RULES:** Any violation of the Rules and Regulations incorporated in this Premium List, the Show Ring Code of Ethics and Junior Division Rules and Regulations may result in forfeiture of all premiums and awards, disqualification, expulsion or probation of the exhibitor, organized group the exhibitor represents, any individual and the exhibitor or livestock involved. Probation, disqualification, expulsion, or other disciplinary action of the Fair Management will be final. Such action will require application for readmission under such terms as the Management may prescribe before the group or individual is allowed to exhibit at future events. All medications will be administered by licensed veterinarians only.
- 17. **USE OF ILLEGAL SUBSTANCES:** The use of any chemical and/or compound that is not approved by the Food and Drug Administration for use in meat producing animals and the illegal use of approved chemicals and/or compounds is prohibited. All animals shall be subject to tests (blood, urine and tissue) for foreign substances that exceed the acceptable levels established by the United States Department of Agriculture and/or the Food and Drug Administration. A positive test will result in disqualification, forfeiture of any premiums and/or awards and will exclude the exhibitor, organized group, or individual involved from future competition at the Tulsa State Fair. All medications will be administered by licensed veterinarians only. Any exhibitor, if requested, is required to present his/her animal to provide samples for DNA testing.
- 18. **JLA CARCASS:** The barrows selected for the Junior Auction will be slaughtered and carcass data obtained. If a barrow should produce a carcass whose value is docked for any reason, the exhibitor will receive a reduced price per pound. The amount of reduction in price will be determined by the rail price received for carcass.
- 19. **CONDEMNED CARCASS:** If a carcass is condemned it will become the financial responsibility of the exhibitor.
- 20. **OTHER PURE BREEDS:** **NEW! All breeds listed in the book will have a breed show. If a breed(s) has less than 40 head of barrows exhibited, they will show in the appropriate classes as determined for the breed by the show management. At the conclusion of the last breed show on Wednesday October 6, all class winners from breeds not meeting the requirement of 40 head will be brought together to determine the Champion and Reserve champion OPB that will return to compete for Grand and Reserve Grand Champion honors. If a breed has more than 40 cards submitted and has less than 40 barrows exhibited in the show, then that particular breed will fall into the OPB. The percentage of OPB barrows in the sale will be based on the cumulative number of barrows from breeds with less than forty head. If there is only one breed that has less than 40 head, then only the breed champion will automatically qualify for the sale.**
- 21. **SELECTION OF JLANEW!:**
 - a. **If only one breed has less than forty head represented at the show, then only the breed champion will automatically qualify for the premium auction.**
 - b. **If a breed has forty or more head represented, the number of head that will qualify for the premium auction from that breed will be based on the percentage that breed makes up of the entire show.**
- 22. **JLA MEETING:** There will be a gathering for all Junior Auction participants immediately following the barrow show at the Swine Arena. It is a requirement that each Junior Auction participant be present. Any and all instructions concerning the Junior Auction will be given at this time. The Swine Committee will be available in the Junior Livestock Auction Area to answer any questions or be of any help to the exhibitor from 10:00 a.m. Friday morning until all the sale animals are loaded out.
- 23. **PQA REQUIREMENTS:** Exhibitors will not be required to complete Pork Quality Assurance (PQA) or PQA Plus prior to the 2010 Tulsa State Fair; however all exhibitors are encouraged to do so. The Oklahoma Pork Council (OPC) will provide additional class premiums for those exhibitors with a current certification in PQA Plus on July 1, 2010. For barrows that place 1st in each class, OPC will add \$25 per barrow. For barrows placing 2nd – 10th in each class, OPC will provide \$5 per barrow. To be eligible for this special premium, the exhibitor of those barrows must be current in PQA Plus certification on July 1, 2010. Additionally, OPC will only purchase animals in the premium sale if the exhibitor was current in PQA Plus on July 1, 2010.
- 24. **CLASSIFICATION:** The Tulsa State Fair has chosen to accept the classification standards as specified by the National Swine Breed Association 2010 Junior Market Livestock Show for the purpose of determining breed characteristics. Barrows who do not meet the the Barrow Classification Standards will not be eligible to compete in the Tulsa State Fair Jr. Market Barrow Show.
- 25. **SCALES:** Each 4-H County or FFA Chapter will be allowed to purchase a scale permit by submitting a \$30 fee for each permit along with entries. All scales must be used at the end of the aisles. Scale stickers will be issued and must be placed on the upper, right hand corner at the back of the scale.
- 26. **PREMIUMS:** The Tulsa State Fair will award premiums on the following schedule:

AWARDS

- Breed Champions (Banner & TSF Award)
- Reserve Breed Champions (Banner & TSF Award)
- Grand Champion Market Barrow (Banner, Traveling Trophy & TSF Award)
- Reserve Grand Champion Market Barrow (Banner, Traveling Trophy & TSF Award)

SPECIAL - The National Swine Registry P.O. Box 2417, West Lafayette, Indiana 47996- 2417, will offer \$5,000 to the Grand Champion Barrow of the junior market hog show if this animal is a registered Duroc, Hampshire, or Yorkshire barrow. The exhibitor must have a transferred pedigree of the Grand Champion Barrow and must present it to the NSR representative at the time of exhibition. This barrow must submit to a DNA verification test. A representative of the National Swine Registry must be present at the time of DNA sampling.

SPECIAL - The National Swine Registry P.O. Box 2417, West Lafayette, Indiana 47996- 2417, will offer \$2,500 to the Reserve Grand Champion Barrow of the junior market hog show if this animal is a registered Duroc, Hampshire, or Yorkshire barrow. The exhibitor must have a transferred pedigree of the Reserve Grand Champion Barrow and must present it to the NSR representative at the time of exhibition. This barrow must submit to a DNA verification test. A representative of the National Swine Registry must be present at the time of DNA sampling.

BARROW CLASSIFICATION STANDARDS

These are the recognized breeds for the 2010 Tulsa State Fair.

BERKSHIRE — SECTION 250

1. A black and white animal with erect ears exhibiting Berkshire character.
2. A Berkshire must have white on all four legs, face and tail (unless tail is docked).
3. Must be ear notched within seven days of birth.
4. A Berkshire must NOT have a solid white or a solid black face from the ears forward.
5. A Berkshire must NOT have a solid black nose (rim of nose).
6. White is allowed on the ears, but NO solid white may appear on the ears.
7. One occasional splash of white may appear only on the lower one-half of the body.

CHESTER WHITE — SECTION 251

1. Must possess Chester White Breed characteristics.
2. Must be ear notched within seven days of birth.
3. Must be solid white in color, no color on the skin larger than a silver dollar, no colored hair.
4. Any skin pigmentation other than white that exceeds five in number are disqualified.
5. Ears must be down and medium size.
6. Any signs of weighted ear tags or evidence of past existence of such ear tags are determined to be not permissible and are grounds for disqualification.

DUROC SWINE — SECTION 252

1. Must be red in color and possess Duroc Breed Character. (ears must be down and medium size).
2. Must be earnotched within seven days of birth.
3. Must NOT have any white hair located on the animal.
4. Must NOT have any black hair.
5. Must NOT have more than three black spots on the skin and none of these spots can be larger than two inches in diameter.
6. Must NOT have any shading or indication of a belt.

HAMPSHIRE — SECTION 253

1. Must be black in color with a white belt starting on the front leg. The belt may partially or totally encircle the body.
2. Must possess Hampshire Breed character (ears must be erect and not rounded).
3. Must be earnotched within seven days of birth.
4. Must NOT have any white hair or indications of streaking on the forehead.
5. Must NOT have any red hair.

POLAND CHINA — SECTION 254

1. Must possess Poland China Breed character.
2. Must be earnotched within seven days of birth.
3. Must be black with six white points (face, feet and tail) with an occasional splash of white on the body. A hog may not possess more than one black leg and be determined as a Poland China. (Tail docking is permissible eliminating that white point.)
4. Must have ears down.
5. Must NOT have evidence of belt formation.
6. Cannot have any red or sandy hair and/or pigment.
7. Hogs that have weighted ear tags or evidence of tampering with possible ear tags are ineligible.

SPOTTED SWINE — SECTION 255

1. Must be black and white.
2. Must possess Spotted Breed character.
3. Must be ear notched within seven days of birth.
4. Ears can not be erect.
5. Any red tinted or brown spots are ineligible.
6. No solid black head from ears forward.
7. No distinct white belt pattern (hair or skin) encircling and extending down and onto each shoulder.
8. Any signs of weighted eartags or evidence of past existence of such tags are determined to be not permissible and are grounds for disqualification.

YORKSHIRE — SECTION 256

1. Must be white in color and possess Yorkshire Breed character. (ears must be erect)
2. Must be earnotched within seven days of birth.
3. Must NOT have any colored hair other than white.
4. Must NOT have colored skin pigmentation larger than one U.S. minted silver dollar.
5. Must NOT have masking above the eyes larger than a silver dollar.

CROSSBRED — SECTION 257

1. Any barrow that does not classify into a breed listed.
