Entry Deadline: August 27, 2010. Open Show entries must be submitted online or mailed in on an official entry form. Entries submitted online will be accepted until 12:00 midnight on August 27. Entries mailed must be postmarked by August 27.

Entry Extension: Entries received prior to August 27, 2010, are able to add additional animals at double the head fees until **September 17, 2010**.

Late Entries: Entries not received prior to August 27, 2010, can enter until **September 17, 2010**, for triple head fees.

Substitutions: Substitutions of animals will be accepted until 12:00 noon the day preceding the show for \$15.00. Change in ownership is not a substitution.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Superintendent must finalize show information by noon the day preceding their show. No changes will be made after this time.
2. The Tulsa State Fair pays 90% of the premiums offered in the American Angus Show and provides all ribbons and banners. All participants are subject to the rules and regulations as set forth in the front of this premium list.

AMERICAN ANGUS ASSOCIATION PARTICIPATION STATEMENT:

3. The American Angus Association, 3201 Frederick Avenue, St. Joseph, Missouri, will pay 10% of the total premiums offered for Open Class Angus Breeding Cattle where individual premiums amount to \$10 or more.
4. A minimum of 50 head must be shown in the Open Class Division to receive American Angus Association premium participation for the following year.
5. Premiums from the association are paid by registration number. Therefore, all cattle should be registered at the time of entry to make certain they receive the association's portion of premiums. The association does not pay a percentage on premiums offered in championship classes.
6. Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate on each animal available for inspection at the show.
7. Any animal upon check-in which does not have a legible tattoo corresponding to its registration certificate is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible tattoo, animals cannot be re-tattooed and rechecked at the show.
8. Any female shown with a calf at side, the calf must be her natural calf and be registered.
9. Only one person at a time shall lead animals into the show ring.
10. For an exhibitor to be eligible at shows for premium monies contributed by the American Angus association, each exhibitor is subject to Part 3, Section IX, Rule 11, "no coloring agents", Rule 11 states" Effective July 1, 2004, at any show for which the AAA appropriates funds toward the payment of premiums, no exhibitors, individuals assisting exhibitors or member owners shall be allowed to use coloring agents on any animals exhibited at such shows.
11. Any product administered internally or used externally to alter the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), use of graphite, powders, hemp or other similar substances externally and steroids, growth stimulants or artificial filling internally. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing. The exhibition of cattle displaying false hair will not be allowed, with the exception of false tail switches.
12. For an exhibitor to be eligible at shows for premium monies contributed by the American Angus Association, each exhibitor is subject to Part 3, Section IX of the Association's rules entitled "Eligibility, Conformation and Structure of Animals Presented for Exhibition"
13. **BLOOD TYPING FOR PARENTAGE VERIFICATION:** Under the Association Rules each animal for which entry application (registration) is received, may be subjected to a blood type test to verify both **ACCURACY OF PARENTAGE AND BLOOD TYPE** as covered under Association Rules Part 3, Section ii, Rule 2(F). Staff of the American Angus Association must supervise the collection of blood samples. Animals are often sampled at shows, fairs or events where the American Angus Association contributes premiums or where Association personnel participate.
14. If a recorded parent is excluded (as a parent) as a result of blood type, the owner may request, at his own expense, the Association to determine the actual parent. Failure to determine the sire and dam disqualifies the animal's eligibility in the Angus Herd Book, and the registration certificate becomes null and void.
