Begin Arrival: Wednesday, September 29, 12:00 noon.

In Place By: Friday, October 1, 12:00 noon.

Entry Deadline: August 27, 2010. Open Show entries may be submitted online or mailed in on an official entry form. Entries submitted online will be accepted until 12:00 midnight on August 27. Entries mailed must be postmarked by August 27.

Entry Extension: Entries received prior to August 27, 2010, are able to add additional animals at double the head fees until **September 17, 2010**.

Late Entries: Entries not received prior to August 27, 2010, can enter until **September 17, 2010**, for triple the head fees.

Substitutions: Substitutions of animals will be accepted until 12:00 noon the day preceding the show for \$15.00. Change in ownership is not a substitution.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Superintendent must finalize the show information by noon the day preceding the show. No changes will be made after this time.
 2. The TSF Limousin show will follow the North American Limousin Foundation rules.
 3. The Oklahoma Limousin Breeders Association will pay 20% of Liability Premiums to the Tulsa State Fair. All premiums will be paid by Tulsa State Fair.
 4. Animals must be registered with the North American Limousin Foundation (NALF). Embryo Transfer (ET) calves with pending registration must have parentage-verification paperwork in the NALF system.
 5. Animals must be purebred or percentage of 75% or higher Limousin (NALF percentage, not actual) with orange papers. All purple papered Lim-Flex are eligible to show.
 6. Animals must be properly tattooed and will be inspected at the show. Tattoos must be legible and must match the registration certificates. If an animal's tattoo is not legible or cannot be read upon initial processing, it will be ineligible to show and not allowed to return with a new or corrected tattoo.
 7. To maintain a high degree of confidence in Limousin shows, the North American Limousin Foundation reserves the right to disqualify any animal that has been fitted in an unethical manner. Unethical fitting shall include the following:
 - a. Any use of paints, hair coloring conditioners, colored show foam, graphite, colored powders or any other substances; all animals subject to a white-towel test;
 - b. The addition of any hair or hair like substances, including false tail heads and false polls (false tail switches are allowed);
 - c. The cutting, tearing or gluing of the hide or underneath the hide or removal of tissue in an attempt to alter the shape of the animal or the injection of any gas, solid or liquid under the hide to alter the normal conformation;
 - d. Any products, solutions or liquids administered internally or externally to alter the conformation of the animal is prohibited. This includes the use of steroids, growth stimulants and the act of artificially filling animals internally, which would include stomach pumping, drench tubes, or any other method.
- EXCEPTIONS:** In the case of severely sick or severely dehydrated animals, the exhibitor may have fluids or electrolytes administered by the licensed official show veterinarian with the approval of the show superintendent or a NALF representative. This exception is not applicable on show day or weigh-in/check-in day.
8. Bulls older than one (1) year must show with a nose-lead. The Limousin Show superintendent and the show management reserve the right to disqualify animals deemed unmanageable.
 9. Protests against exhibitors, individual animals or fitting violations must be submitted in writing, signed by five (5) active members of the NALF and presented to the show superintendent within 12 hours after the completion of the show.
 10. NALF reserves the right to mouth animals for dental development.
 11. NALF reserves the right to collect hair samples from any animal.
 12. All cattle will be processed before the show.
 13. Classes and championship breaks will be determined after all cattle have been checked in. No class shall contain more than 20 head or have an age spread of more than 60 days unless the animals are older than two years.
 14. Animals shown must be solid red or black above the flanks, excluding birth marks.

OTHER REQUIREMENTS

The following performance-data-submission requirements must be met by December 1 to receive Medal of Excellence points.

- a. Birth weight (bulls & heifers)
- b. Weanling weight (bulls heifers)
- c. Yearling weight (bulls & heifers)
- d. Yearling scrotal circumference
- e. Pregnancy test (females older than 600 days old at season's end)
- f. Breeding Soundness Exam & Semen Test (all bulls over 400 days old)

NOTE: Failure to have performance data on file at NALF by the deadline will result in disqualification from the MOE program, and no points will be awarded. It is the responsibility of the breeder/owner/exhibitor to submit that information without special requests from NALF.

Credibility Requirement: To maintain a high degree of integrity and credibility in all Limousin shows, all owners and exhibitors will be expected to adhere to all NAL rules and regulations regarding the exhibition of Limousin cattle and adhere to rules or regulations of particular shows, fairs and exhibitions.

Medal of Excellence Point Distribution: The new point distribution for Medal of Excellence shows will depend on the number of head exhibited at each MOE show other than the 4 national shows.

 Three (3) head shown in individual classes calved on or after September 1, 2006. Both sexes may be represented.
55. Senior Get-of-Sire (Premium A)
 Four (4) head shown in individual classes any age. Both sexes may be represented.
56. Breeders Best 5 Head (Premium A)
 Five (5) head shown in individual classes. Must be bred by and owned or co-owned by exhibitor. Both sexes may be represented.
