Entry Deadline: August 27, 2010. Open Show entries may be submitted online or mailed in on an official entry form. Entries submitted online will be accepted until 12:00 midnight on August 27. Entries mailed must be postmarked by August 27.

Entry Extension: Entries received prior to August 27, 2010, are able to add additional animals at double the head fees until September 17, 2010.

Late Entry: Entries not received prior to August 27, 2010, can enter until **September 17, 2010**, for triple the head fees.

Substitutions: Substitutions of animals will be accepted until 12:00 noon the day preceding the show for \$15.00. Change in ownership is not a substitution.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Superintendent must finalize the show information by noon the day preceding the show. No changes will be made after this time.
2. The American Shorthorn Association (ASA), Dr. Greg Ruhle, Executive Secretary, 8288 Hascall Street, Omaha, NE 68124, will pay open show exhibitors an additional 20% of each individual premium paid by the amounting to \$10.00 or more. No exhibitor will be paid more than two premiums in an individual class, and the Association does not pay additional premiums in the championship classes. The ASA's share of the premiums will be handled as account credits directly through their office in Omaha, Nebraska.
3. In order for an exhibitor to be eligible to receive the American Shorthorn Association's (ASA) share of the premiums at an ASA supported show, the owner's entire herd must be enrolled in the Shorthorn Performance Records (SPR) Program and each animal shown must have individual SPR records.
4. All cattle must be purebred to be eligible to show.
5. No exhibitor shall be permitted to win more than two prizes in any one class.
6. All animals must be registered as the property of the exhibitor in the records of the ASA by the time of the fair or show.
7. Individual animals shown in all of the group classes listed below must have been entered and shown in one of the following classes for single animals. Multiple owned animals must be exhibited in the names of all owners.
8. Family bred and raised animals entered by juniors in Junior Classes and subsequently entered in Open Classes may be treated as family entries in group classes. Group classes need to be pre-entered.
9. All Shorthorns and Polled Shorthorns are subject to a tattoo inspection by representatives of the ASA. All Shorthorn and Polled Shorthorn are also subject to an age inspection if deemed necessary by the ASA and the decision of the examining veterinarian is final. Use of artificial fins on show animals is not permitted.
10. Senior/Junior Yearling Pregnancy Rule for exhibitors at all Open shows: Any senior/junior yearling female 28 months of age or older on or before the date of the show must have a natural calf at side and must be shown with such. All females 20 months of age on or before the date of the show must have a 60 day pregnancy verification signed by an accredited, non-owner veterinarian at the time the female is processed for the show. If verification cannot be produced, the female may be allowed to participate if the exhibitor can produce a qualified veterinarian to examine the female at the show site, and verify a 60-day pregnancy. Any infractions against this rule will lead to disqualification of that animal for that specific show.
11. All accounts of owner must be in financial good standing to be eligible to enter the show ring. Any and all monies will be applied to entry and show fees before being applied to exhibitor admission tickets.

48. <u>Super Cow class</u>		(Premium A)
Class should consist of two (2) offspring of either or same sex of show age classification. Offspring do not need owned by the same exhibitor. No more than one pair from each cow can win a prize in the class.		
49. <u>Get-of-Sire class</u>		(Premium A)
Class should consist of four offspring of either or same sex of any age from the same sire. Offspring do not need to be owned by the same exhibitor. No more than one group from each sire can win a prize in this class.		
50. <u>Best six head</u>		(Premium A)
Owned or co-owned by exhibitor.
