Entry Deadline: August 27, 2010. Entries must be submitted online or mailed in on an official entry form. Entries submitted online will be accepted until 12:00 midnight on August 27. Entries mailed must be postmarked by August 27.

Entry Extension: Entries received prior to August 27 are able to add additional animals at double head fees until **September 17, 2010**.

Late Entries: Entries not received prior to August 27, 2010 can enter until **September 17, 2010** for triple head fees.

Substitutions: Substitutions of animals will be accepted until 12:00 noon, the day preceding the show for \$15.00. Change in ownership is not a substitution.

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Each Superintendent must finalize the show information by noon the day preceding the show. No changes will be made after this time.
2. **SANCTIONING:** This is an officially sanctioned ADGA Show - ADGA rules will govern. The Junior and Senior shows are separately sanctioned.
3. **ENTRIES:** All entries must be submitted online or mailed in on an official Tulsa State Fair entry blank. If mailing, you must use a separate entry form for each breed you enter. You should consider mailing your entries via registered or certified mail to ensure arrival at this office.
4. **FEES:** Goats, per head: \$20.00
5. **PASSES:** Exhibitor passes are included with entry fees. Exhibitor Passes are good for five (5) days of the fair. Additional tickets may be purchased at Gate 7 or in the Livestock Office.
6. **REGISTRATION PAPERS:** The original registration certificate is required for all animals six months of age or older and this **MUST** be shown to the Show Secretary before the start of the show. The original registration certificate or duplicate application stamped by the ADGA Office is required for all animals under six months of age and this **MUST** be shown to the Show Secretary before the start of this show. No copies of the registration certificate or the stamped application, faxes or phone calls will be accepted in lieu of the original certificate. The animal must be owned by the exhibitor.
7. **AGE:** The base date for computing the age of the animal shall be the day the animal is to be judged.
8. **GROUP CLASSES:** Animals eligible for group classes must have shown in individual classes All group classes of a breed must be made up of only those animals that have been shown in the individual classes of that breed in this show, and must be entered on the official entry blank.
9. **PRE-SHOW MILKOUT:** There will be **NO** pre-show milkout.
10. **READ GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS:** All exhibitors will be required to follow the General Rules and Regulations, Health and Sanitary Regulations and the Show Ring Code of Ethics as outlined in the front of this book.
11. Only animals entered in the Tulsa State Fair Show or animals that are a part of a Fair permitted exhibit will be allowed to stay in the barn.
12. **PENS:** No **tents** or **tent like structures** will be permitted in the Dairy Goat pen area. Back drops and side curtains will be permitted on tack pens. However, these must be no higher than regular pen height. Farm and club displays may be set up in Dairy Goat pen areas.
13. **VIOLATION OF RULES:** The above rules will be strictly enforced. Penalty for violation of the above rules see Rule 1 Section 2 of Rules and Regulations in front of book.
14. **TATTOOS:** All dairy goats entered in this Dairy Goat show must have a tattoo. Any goat said to be without a tattoo by the judge of the show will forfeit the premium money given by the Tulsa State Fair. The next goat in that class line will be moved up to receive the premium money.
15. **PICTURES:** Champion and Reserve Champion animals from each breed must be taken to the backdrop for photographs immediately following completion of each day's show.

SPECIALS

Specials and groups must be pre-entered and shown on the entry blank. Please read all rules for Group Classes and enter your animals only where they are eligible.

BEST UDDER: Judge will pick one doe from each Senior Doe Class to compete for this award. **Does must be milked out for this class.** To be eligible to win an award, doe must be pre-entered, by name, and shown in Open Senior Doe classes.

PREMIER EXHIBITOR: This award to be made to the exhibitor winning the most money on 8 animals owned and exhibited by him in the open single classes; award automatically figured on top 8 animals winning the most money.

PREMIER BREEDER: This award to be made to the breeder of, not to exceed, 8 animals winning the most money in open single classes, including animals bred by him but exhibited by others; award automatically figured on top 8 animals winning the most money.

GROUPS

JUNIOR GET OF SIRE: To consist of 3 junior does, the get of one sire. Sire must be named. Exhibitor limited to 1 entry per buck. Bucks must be named.

JUNIOR PRODUCE OF DAM: To consist of 2 junior does, the daughters of 1 dam. Dam to be named. Each exhibitor limited to 2 entries.

JUNIOR BEST 3 FEMALES: To consist of 3 does, all owned by exhibitor. (Each exhibitor limited to one entry.)

CHAMPION CHALLENGE: The following rules must apply:

- A. Permanent champions may show in either the regular or Challenge class, whichever the owner chooses.
- B. The Grand Champion of the same show must show in these classes and winners of them shall be called "Best of Breed".
- C. If the Grand Champion of the day does not win this class, she shall not compete in the Best Doe in Show Class - the winner of the Challenge class shall.

SENIOR DAM AND DAUGHTER: (Limit 2 entries per exhibitor.) To consist of dam and her daughter. Each entry must consist of one dam and one daughter (no trios) dam or daughter may be entered only once. Both animals must be senior does.

SENIOR GET OF SIRE: To consist of three does from the Senior Division, the get of one sire. Sire must be named. Exhibitor limited to one entry by the same buck.

SENIOR PRODUCE OF DAM: To consist of two does from the Senior Division, the daughters of one dam. Dam must be named. Exhibitor limited to two entries.

SENIOR BEST THREE FEMALES: To consist of three Senior Does, all owned by exhibitor. (Each exhibitor limited to one entry.)

DAIRY HERD: To consist of four does in milk, all owned by one exhibitor. Each exhibitor limited to one entry.

SECTIONS 171 - 179 YOUTH DAIRY GOAT SHOW

This show is open to all 4-H, FFA and ADGA youth. Youth will show within the Open Show.

The Junior and Senior shows are separately sanctioned. After the judge has placed the class those not entered in the youth show will leave the ring, and youth will hold their place so ribbons can be given them and placing recorded. Youth entries must be made on a **separate entry form** and the word **YOUTH** written on the form by exhibitor's name.

Entries are limited to one animal per child, per class. Youth exhibitors may show animals in both Youth and Open classes provided they pay the required processing fee. It is required that youth enter in the open class to participate in the youth show. Animals will be governed by the health rules described in the General Rules and Regulations and will pay a processing fee of \$20 per animal entered in the Youth Show.
